

Preparing your personal timetable

Course numbers

The first digit indicates the year in which a course is normally taken. Courses beginning with '1' indicate first year level courses (eg ECON 1005, PSYC 1105, CHMI 1006).

The final digit indicates whether the course is a 6 credit course (ending in '0' or '5'), a 3 credit course (ending in '6' or '7') or a course with varying credit value (ending in '4').

Courses ending in '8' or '9' have a credit value of 1 or 1.5 credits respectively.
